



St Johns Anglican Cathedral

offers the following opportunities for choral musicians

CHORAL SINGERS

under the direction of Graeme Morton

Cathedral Choir (Exaudi) – a remunerated choir of men and boys possibly with women altos – generally singing 3 Sunday mornings and one Sunday evening a month (the second Sunday is generally free of cathedral responsibilities)

Cathedral Choir (Laudibus) – an honorary choir of men and boys with some woman altos singing morning and evening on the second Sunday of the month.

Cathedral Singers – an honorary mixed voice choir of mostly young adults singing Sunday Evening (Evensong) two or three Sundays per month

Cathedral Chamber Choir (also the Brisbane Chamber Choir) – One of this city's very exciting choral ensembles. The Brisbane Chamber Choir sings occasionally in the cathedral in both services and concerts. Further details of this ensemble are available at www.brisbanechamberchoir.org

Boys (trebles) – Entry in grade 4 or 5 with 50% scholarship to Anglican Church Grammar School. These choristers sing as part of Exaudi and Laudibus. These boys enjoy access to some of the greatest choral repertoire, and learn under the direction of three outstanding choral tutors and vocal coaches. Boys only rehearsals occur before school at Churchie three mornings a week.

Full Rehearsals are held on Friday evenings (5.30pm-7.00pm) and immediately prior to the services.

Services – Sunday Mass (9.30am)
Sunday Evensong (6.00pm)

Singers must have some experience as a choral musician and undergo an audition. The ability to read music is essential. Singers need not be Anglican, nor have any particular religious affiliation.

St John's Cathedral is one of this country's iconic buildings and has an amazing acoustic. It maintains a musical tradition based on the great music from the Renaissance to the present. To sing in this space, and accompanied by the fabulous cathedral organ, is a musical thrill rarely experienced elsewhere.
